We were in the intensive care ward, and she calmly went about feeding him, massaging his I arm which is not working and putting boots on his limp feet so that he does not get a dropped foot.

They looked lovingly at each other so many times during the visit, so grateful that he was still alive.

She on the other hand, was diagnosed with breast cancer a few months ago before his accident, but the head covering hiding her hair loss as a result of ongoing chemotherapy, was not enough to even dent the glory of the Lord shining out of that face.

She rushed home afterwards to make sure she was in time to get her four young daughters to bed. One of them, adopted, has severe cerebral palsy and needs permanent attention.

I can't hide my tears as I write this.

Those of you who know them, know of whom I am speaking and will understand what I mean when I say that it is only their remarkable faith and the presence of the Lord with them that makes this possible.

In the midst of all this trauma, they tell me of how good God has been to them and of the little miracles along the journey. They wear the face of Jesus in the presence of all these setbacks and talk of His goodness despite it all.

Nobody has an answer as to why a Godfearing family should have been so attacked. We lamely quote Job but it's a feeble attempt to explain how the enemy got at blood washed believers who are serving Jesus faithfully.

Many people run away from the Lord in times of difficulty. They did not.

As I hear them discuss the hope of graduating from a hospital bed to a wheelchair and how he is going to convert the car so he can drive, yet still trust for recovery of the spinal nerves, I realize that in the Presence of the Lord all is well.

God really can work all things together for His glory and the Jesus I saw in them last night is alive and well.

Circumstance cannot rule us ever!

So, this Christmas, let us press in afresh to His Presence.

Look for the daily miracles and remember what Paul said to the Romans:

³⁸ And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. ³⁹ No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38–39 NLT)

Can we ever be grateful enough for the salvation we have received in Christ Jesus?

Will 'thank you" ever be sufficient?

When the childhood joy of Christmas fades and you find yourself just going through the motions, I plead with you, remember the glorious Saviour who came to earth, who lived among us and then shed His blood for our sin that we might be born again into an eternal
